- How has Lent prepared you for the message of Easter?
- How might the good news of Christ's resurrection renew you today?

DEVOTIONS



The readings for the Easter Vigil give a summary of God's saving work in history, from the gift of creation and God's plan to reject human sacrifices, to the new birth of Israel foretold by Ezekiel and the resurrection of Jesus. The Easter Vigil is that one time of year to read several Bible texts, sit quietly in reflection, and meditate on God's work in history. It is also a time to baptize people into the Christian faith. As it states in Romans 6:4, "Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life." Through baptism Christ's death and resurrection shapes our life as well. We experience a daily dying to the old self and the rising of the new self to live with God now and always. Christ's resurrection impacts not only our future resurrection, but a daily resurrection that frees us from our old sinful selves and for the love of God and neighbor. How do you see Christ's resurrection freeing you today to live for God and others?

Pray: Dear God, may the Spirit of Christ give us new life that we may celebrate with you and all the saints that Christ is risen, indeed. Alleluia!

SERVICE



The African American slave's spiritual song, *Dem Bones* is from the story of the valley of dry bones from Ezekiel 37:1-14. The song gave a vision of hope and freedom. There are still many places in the world today where people are not free. Pray that those who seek freedom may hear the word of the Lord. Keep the work of missionaries in your prayers.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



The word *Alleluia* is traditionally not used during Lent. It is "buried" in Lent to be resurrected with Easter. Remove the black cloth that was placed on the Lenten Candle Cross on Good Friday. Light the white candle in the center of the cross and share the good news by saying: **Christ is risen; He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!**
